

We Kept Our Word – At Last We're Free!

Dear Constituents,

As many of you will know, I have long campaigned for Britain to leave the European Union. During the General Election, Boris Johnson's Conservatives were re-elected with a very clear majority and a central plank of their manifesto was to "Get Brexit Done." We subsequently passed the necessary legislation within a matter of weeks and we finally left the European Union at 11:00pm on the 31st January 2020.



Given the complex history of this whole issue and, in particular, that despite our people voting to leave the EU in the 2016 Referendum, some MPs in the House of Commons spent three years using every Parliamentary device they could invent, in order to frustrate that decision, it was even more important in upholding the democratic process, that, this time, Members of Parliament kept their word to the British People. I was very pleased to vote for the necessary legislation, so that now we can be a free country once again.

There are now important trade negotiations to conduct, so that we can sign a comprehensive Free Trade Agreement. This should allow us to trade with our European partners with low, or in some cases, even no tariffs, looking into the foreseeable future. This will most likely be based on some variant of the EU-Canadian Free Trade Agreement, which was signed in 2016. I believe that it is very possible to agree this deal by the end of 2020 (based in part on the fact that the Prime Minister, Boris Johnson MP, managed to successfully re-negotiate Theresa May's old deal in under three months).

All that said, I hope we can now leave behind the old labels of "Leaver" and "Remainer," going back to simply being "Brits." Working together as one country, I believe we can go out bravely into the world, as the fifth largest economy on earth and that we can succeed economically - not least because we will be able to make trade deals of our own choosing, including hopefully with the United States, India and others as well.

Finally, this has been a long and at times difficult journey, but I am pleased that, at last, our Members of Parliament have been able to keep the promise that we gave to the British people back in 2016, to honour the result of the Referendum. This has finally been done and, as your Member of Parliament, I am proud to have been a part of it – and to have kept my word.
